CLASS NEWS



YEAR R NEWS

Reception have had a very busy week which began with a super World Book Day on Monday. All the children looked fantastic in their costumes and enjoyed sharing who they had chosen to come as, and why they enjoyed that story. We shared lots of wonderful stories throughout the day!

This week, Reception have been busy practising phonics. We have been working hard to learn how to write super sentences including the a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop. We have also been practising our tricky words. Please make sure you keep practising them at home too!

In Maths, we have been focusing on the number 11. We created our own concept board with lots of facts about the number. In our focus groups we have been practising addition. We learnt about the symbols we use when we add and how we find the total. We have also continued to practise counting in 2's.

In RE, we heard the story of Zacchaeus and how Jesus helped him to say sorry. We enjoyed retelling this story in small groups with some super acting! We talked about how sometimes it can be hard for us to say sorry, but we can turn to Jesus to help us do this.



It was lovely to start this week with an amazing World Book Day at school. The children were very excited about their costumes and eager to talk about the books that they love. We had a day filled with book-themed activities, including creating an interpretive dance to tell the story of 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' and choosing between lots of exciting activities in the afternoon.

In Maths this week Year 1 have been continuing their work on numbers to 50. We compared numbers within 50 using inequality symbols, and used the story of 'The Tiger who Came to Tea' to think about one more and one less within 50.

In English this week we used our story to create party invitations. We thought about all the details an invitation needs, and included exclamation marks and adjectives to make it more exciting!

In Science this week we have been continuing Miss Armitage's favourite topic - animals! Year 1 shared their knowledge of different animals and used this to group animals into mammals, amphibians, fish, birds and reptiles. We talked about animals' skin and the patterns we see in nature, which we will also use in art this half term.

Thank you to everyone who helped Year 1 prepare for leading our KS1 Mass on Thursday. Miss Armitage, Miss Milnes and Mrs Walsh were all so proud of the children, and their beautiful reading and behaviour in church.

YEAR 2 NEWS

Year 2's World Book Day celebrations were enjoyed by everyone on Monday. We talked about why we had chosen our particular character and wrote mini book reviews behind these choices. Well done to all of Year 2 for your fabulous costumes.

This week in Maths, we have continued our unit on fractions. We have been learning some of the different methods to find a fraction of a number (1/2 and 1/4). We used lots of practical resources and bar modelling to help us see the equivalence between 1/2 and 2/4.

In English, we have been looking at the key features of a newspaper article, focusing on the introduction (who, what, when and where) and including factual information. We also practised writing punchy and exciting headlines.

In RE we have reflected on how we prepare spiritually throughout the forty days of Lent. We thought about the three traditional practices to be taken up with renewed vigour during this time: prayer, fasting and almsgiving and identified the different ways that we have been doing this CAFOD Faith lunch, Toast Tuesdays etc...

On Friday, Y2 finished our week with our class assembly. Our week ended on a high when we performed our brilliant mini production of Peer Gynt and the Trolls. Mrs Knight was very impressed with our singing and acting and we thoroughly enjoyed ourselves throughout the performance!

YEAR 3 NEWS

The week started with World Book Day and the children had great fun dressing up as their favourite book characters. We enjoyed lots of reading activities throughout the day. in English we have been investigating some tricky words ending in -gue and -que. The children were using jumbled up letters to form these new words. They were very good at doing this. The children are continuing to work hard to learn their weekly spelling lists.

In our Maths lessons we have been continuing partitioning and using a grid method to multiply two x one digit numbers..

In P.E the children had a visit from a Judo trainer and had the chance to join in many fun Judo games. They really enjoyed their coaching session. This week the class have also been taking part in our 'Eat them to defeat them' challenge. This involves trying to eat different healthy vegetables. Our healthy food ambassadors, Freddie and Leila enjoyed sharing out our fresh carrots in KS2.



YEAR 4 NEWS

In RE this week, Year Four began their new topic of 'Jesus the Saviour'. We discussed the Mystery of the Incarnation, finding examples in the Bible of both Jesus as God and human. We then reflected on what this means to us.

We started English this week with a fabulous World Book Day. We carried out lots of different reading exercises, looking at prediction and different styles of stories. For our class book work, we focused on synonyms to emphasis different levels of meaning. We role-played our thoughts of what it would be like to leave our family, before writing a telegram back home detailing out different emotions. We then looked at descriptive writing, describing the Antarctic.

In Maths, we carried on our 3-digit by 1-digit division problems before moving on to looking at correspondence problems. We then moved on to fraction, thinking about what a fraction is before learning about equivalent fractions.

In History this week, we learnt about how the Romans invaded Britain. We researched into the two failed Roman attempts and their final success.

YEAR 5 NEWS

On Monday, we celebrated World Book Day by coming dressed as our favourite book character. During the day, we wrote a blurb about the character that we came dressed as. In the afternoon, we created our own characters and a story line for a comic strip. We looked at the author-illustrator Sophine Henn and watched a video where she explained how she created her comic, from this we created our own.

In Maths, we have been developing our understanding of converting improper fractions to mixed numbers and vice-versa. We used lots of bar models to represent this clearly and from this we could explain our answers. Also, we began to sequence fraction in a number line forwards and backwards.

In Computing, we started programming a sequence of codes to make a game on Scratch called 'Catch the dots'. We had to carefully sequence the codes so that the controller sprite would move when used the arrow keys and create other sprites so that the controller could catch them. We really enjoyed working with our partners to make a game.



YEAR 6 NEWS

Year 6 have had a fun few days at Robinwood doing all sorts of activities including: archery, big swing, crate stacking & caving. There will be more news in next week's newsletter—we hope you have enjoyed the photos and updates via twitter.
