We Need Your Recycling


We will be creating a series of 'Under the Sea' displays using recycled materials such as bottle tops, wrappers and other recyclable materials. We do not need cardboard, thank you.

CLASS NEWS



YEAR R NEWS

This week, Reception have been learning about non-fiction books. We learnt about how these books tell us real facts and information. We also looked at the key features of these types of books such as the contents page and the index page. We explored a number of books about space and learnt lots of exciting facts. Some of which we wrote about.

In Maths this week, we have been learning about ordering numbers and counting.

On Friday it was Number Day. We enjoyed doing a number hunt around the classroom. We then put all the numbers in the correct order. The children worked very well as a team and did some brilliant problem solving. As part of Number Day, on Friday afternoon our buddies came to help us play bingo. It was great fun!

This week we have also started our special topic all about ' Under the Sea'. On Thursday we learnt all about the different oceans and about the different sea creatures that might live in each ocean. We are really looking forward to learning more next week!



YEAR 1 NEWS

We have had a very busy assessment week seeing how much progress we have made in all our subjects. Year 1 have all worked very hard and have made sure to take a break after all the tricky work!

In English Miss Milnes has taught us how to write a persuasive letter to tell people why littering is wrong. We made sure to use capital letters and full stops, as well as phrases like 'in my opinion'.

In Maths we have started our new topic on place value to 50. As part of Number Day everyone in class chose a number greater than 20 but less than 30 and made a 'place value apple'. We showed our number as a numeral, word, in base 10, as a tally, in a tens and one grid and in ten frames.

We launched our topic week and are going to the answer the question 'Can plastic in Otley affect penguins in Antarctica?' We have used Google Earth to plot the plastic's journey to Antarctica and the different seas and oceans it would float through.

We have lots of exciting science experiments and design projects planned for next week! We are going to look at why plastic is everywhere, and why it is such a problem.



YEAR 2 NEWS

In English this week, we have been thinking about our letter writing technique. With our forthcoming topic week on oceans in the forefront of our minds, we decided to write letters to either an organisation (Sainsbury's) or our Prime Minister asking for their support to reduce the amount of plastic pollution in our oceans.

We have started our new topic in History this week, *People Who Have Made a Difference* and have been learning about the life of Florence Nightingale, who is famous for her nursing of wounded soldiers during the Crimean War.

In preparation for our Skipping Festival in June, we had a skipping workshop on Tuesday. Jodie came from Leeds Skipping School to help us with our technique and prepare us for the various routines that we will be performing. If you would like to buy a skipping rope (the kind that we practise with and are used in the festival) they are £5.

In RE, we listened to the story of one of Jesus' miracles. Jairus was a Jewish religious leader who worshipped God and taught God's words to others. When his 12 year old daughter became ill and close to death, Jairus knew only one person could help her... When the girl died, nobody believed that Jesus could bring her back to life. This miracle helped us to remember the power of Jesus' wonderful love and to believe in Him.

Maths has been all about investigating this week. We have been learning about factors of numbers. On Friday, which was Number Day we did lots of practical maths including the Mathopoly game. In the afternoon, we used our number skills again with the Mini Vinnies who came and played Bingo with us.



In English, we have been using descriptive language to create an image. We looked at a picture of a dark, gloomy beach and used a range of adjectives and expanded noun phrases to describe to our partner. Eva commented, "I loved creating my description and imagining I was on the beach."

In Maths, we have also been looking at 3 digit subtraction. We used models and representation using base 10 and place value counters alongside the calculation method so that we understand what is happening when we are subtracting two numbers.

In Science, we looked at magnets and magnetic fields. We discussed the north and south poles, and how they attract and repel each other. Finally, we looked at materials which were magnetic and nonmagnetic.

In our Assembly, we learned about the story of David and Goliath. We thought about how brave David was, and how he trusted God. Philippa said, "It shows how little things can make a big difference." We really enjoyed playing our ukulele to an audience as we work towards our Red Award in Music.

This week in RE, Year Four have been thinking about the different parts of the Mass. We learned about why we receive Holy Communion in Mass, and how it (and other parts within the Mass) shape how we live our lives.

In Maths, we used the expanded and short method for calculating a '2-digit by 1-digit' multiplication before applying this to '3digit by 1-digit' calculations. Next, we moved onto division; looking at practical methods for dividing a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number. We thought about if we know how to divide something by 2 we can apply that to dividing by 4 or 8.

In Geography, we learnt facts about the 7 oceans. We then focused on The Great Barrier Reef; studying its habitat as a food source, and as a place for leisure activities. We researched the damage caused by humans, and how we

can do little things to help protect the marine environment. We presented our findings on posters. In History, we researched the different legions and types of soldiers of the Roman Army, as well as what they did to train and what they wore in battle.

On Friday, for NSPCC number day, our Chair of Governors came to carry out some Maths Magic with us - we are definitely going to be tricking our parents this weekend! We also played bingo with our Minnie Vinnies to raise money for charity.

In English, we continued to write and edit our prequels to 'The Lost Happy Endings'. After we completed writing our stories, we edited them using editing stations. We had to focus on various aspects of our writing; such as: spelling, grammar, punctuation and variety of vocabulary. We redrafted our stories by typing the up on the laptop, we really enjoyed this.

During Maths this week, we started our new topic of fractions. We looked at what a fraction is and how it can be represented. We moved on to finding equivalent fractions using Numicon and Cuisenaire.

On Friday, we had a visit from our Chair of Governors, Mr Thompson, who taught us a number of Maths tricks and games. We loved it!

In RE, we began to look at why Jesus is our Saviour and how that helps us in our day to day lives. We thought about some of the qualities which Jesus showed throughout his life and we used the Bible to find examples of these.

This week, the children in Year 6 have started their Geography work on Mountains. They found out what the definition of a mountain is; used Atlases to label mountain ranges in the UK; used Atlases to locate some of the biggest mountain ranges in the world and found out the heights of some of the mountains in the UK and the World. I

In RE, the children continued their work on the Mass and thought about the different parts of the Mass in more detail. The children also took part in a Circletime linked to our current Virtue in Collective Worship -Simplicity.

In French, we have been learning the names of different food—a very important skill!

In English today, the children started our "Saving our Oceans" by writing a letter to supermarkets encouraging them to use less plastic.

A reminder that next week, Year 6 will be completing their Bikeability training. A text was sent explaining which days your child will be riding. All children will be taking part on Monday so they need to wear warm clothes suitable for riding a bike.
