

COLLECTIVE WORSHIP

In our Collective Worship, the children have continued to focus on the virtue of patience. This week, we listened to the Gospel of Matthew telling us about John the Baptist telling people to turn away from their sins and change as the Kingdom of heaven is near. Thew children reflected on how some changes take time and how we should be patient with each other and ourselves as we try to change into better



On Friday, Year 4 led the Whole School Collective Worship with the theme of Hannukah. They talked about the history of the Jewish festival and how Jewish people celebrate it. Like Christmas and Diwali, light is an important symbol of Hanukkah and they light the Menorah candle during the celebrations.

YEAR R NEWS

In Literacy, we have been labelling the Christmas items. We used our phonics to see which sounds we could hear in each word. We are doing so well with our writing!

In Maths, we have been learning about the part-whole model on numbers to 5. We are getting very good at identifying which numbers we can add together to make an amount up to 5.

On Thursday, we enjoyed doing our reindeer run. We managed an amazing 15 laps around the large playground. All the children encouraged each other and did a super job! We also had a very yummy Christmas lunch!

We have done our first dress rehearsal for our Nativity. We all look really smart in our costumes. Thank you to parents.

We hope you enjoyed our Welcome Assembly. We are so proud of the children, and the way they have settled in so well to life at St Joseph's.



YEAR 1 NEWS


This week in Maths we have continued to look at different techniques for subtraction. We have now started to look at different representations of subtraction using ten frames, part whole models and the crossing out method.

In English this week, we reread the story, 'Harvey Slumfenburger's Christmas Present.' We thought about all the different ways that Father Christmas travelled to get to Harvey's house. We used our brilliant imaginations to come up with some of our own fantastic ways to travel using verbs, adverbs and adjectives.

In RE we have been learning about Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem. We thought about why they had to travel such a long way and reflected on how they must have been feeling.

In Art & DT we have been putting the finishing touches on some of our Christmas crafts. We enjoyed putting our decorations on the tree in the hall they look beautiful.

Thank you for all of the fantastic costumes for our Christmas production. On Friday afternoon, we had a dress rehearsal. We are looking forward to showing our mums and dads and carers next week.



YEAR 2 NEWS

On Monday, we took part in the Reindeer Run for charity. The children really enjoyed running the course; it was a fantastic way to start our week.

In Maths, we have been adding three 1-digit numbers. We have been looking for number bonds to 10 and finding doubles to help us. We also found out that we can partition one of the numbers to make a bond to 10. We will be practising this in our homework this week.

As part of our English work, we have been editing and redrafting. We looked at a piece of writing and found that the writer had used 'and then' too many times! We Read through the piece together and thought carefully about how we could change it. Sometimes we just needed a full stop, other times we used and adverb such as 'suddenly'.

In RE, we used an app called i-Motion to animate the story of the Nativity. We had to think very carefully about the order of events and which characters were needed in each scene. Next week, we hope to add a narration to tell the story.


Finally, we finished making our chairs for baby Bear in DT. The children had lots of fun constructing the chairs and adding their own personal flair and design.





YEAR 3 NEWS

In English this week we have been sequencing the key parts of The First Drawing story using pictures and writing a summary of the main events using adverbials of time and place.





In History, we answered the question 'How much did life change for Stone Age man when he started to farm?' We compared images of Hunter-Gatherers and Neolithic farmers and thought about how important the changes would have been for them.

In our Collective Worship this week we have been reflecting on the virtue of Patience. We listened to bible readings about John the Baptist and talked about the value of having patience.

YEAR 4 NEWS

This week in English we have been working on developing the fluency and clarity of our reading. We have focused on the poem, "Twas the Night Before Christmas", and each child has timed themselves reading then rereading the poem over several days. We already have 4 children in the class who have learned the first 6 verses by heart!

In Maths, we have consolidated our knowledge of multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100. We discussed the importance of place value, as this helps you see the pattern when using multiples of 10 and 100 as factors.

In RE, we reflected on how the birth of Jesus was the fulfilment of several promises God made. The children used Bible references to find promises that God made to Mary, Joseph, Zechariah and David, as well as prophecies from Isaiah. We also thought about Christian beliefs that come from the Nativity, and explained some of the titles we give Jesus.

We attended Reconciliation on Thursday, and it was lovely to see the children behave so reverently and feel so peaceful.

Thank you to all the parents who attended our class assembly. The children really worked to project their voices - we apologise for the audio difficulties during the assembly!

YEAR 5 NEWS

This half term, the children have enjoyed listening to The Odyssey by Homer retold by Gillian Cross. This week, we finished the book and found out how Odysseus finally got home after his epic 10 year journey from the Trojan War. We have used this story to inspire us to write newspaper articles about Odysseus' journey pretending we were a Greek reporter at the time.

Our focus in Maths this week has been cube numbers where we used blocks to help us calculate cube numbers. We have also been multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 & 1000 which the children did brilliantly at.

In ICT this week, the children enjoyed writing scripts for their videos that they are going to record about one of their interests/hobbies.

In DT, the children started to make a truss bridge using spaghetti and masking tape. First of all, the children had to make 6 bundles of 10 pieces of spaghetti and then tape these together. They then had to break these bundles into 3 equal pieces and use them to make triangles. Next week, we shall hopefully finish them off.



YEAR 6 NEWS

In English, we looked at the features of a discussion text. For our lesson, we thought about the positive and negative aspects of online learning. The children created a structured paragraph to form an argument of both points of view using formal language, rhetorical questions and emotive language.

In Maths, we have looked at fractions on a number line - ranging from 0 to beyond 1. We also compared fractions with the same denominator and same numerator. We discussed the most efficient method when comparing and ordering fractions. Finally, we practised adding and subtracting fractions with different denominators.

In History, we looked at propaganda posters aimed at women on the Home Front. By analysing the posters, we looked at the persuasive features and impact they would have had for women during this time. We also looked at rationing and discovered the upper class continued to visits restaurants despite the limited food during these hard times. We discussed the injustice of food distribution during the war and how this relates to today.
