At St Joseph's, we have backed a campaign for shirt donations in memory of late non-league player Jordan Sinnott.



### **CLASS NEWS**



#### YEAR R NEWS

This week, Reception have had great fun learning about our special topic week 'Saving our Oceans'. We started the week by reading the story 'Commotion in the Ocean', and then wrote about our favourite type of sea creature.

On Monday, we did a science experiment. We learnt about the different oceans and how they are being polluted with rubbish. We also learnt about how this is impacting on our sea life, and what we can do to try to reduce the amount of pollution.

On Tuesday, we enjoyed a story time session at the library. We heard the story 'Someone Swallowed Stanley'. We made jelly fish using lots of recycled materials and drew under the sea pictures. We also had the opportunity to explore all the books that the library has to offer.

On Wednesday, we had great fun making a 'socktopus' with our buddies. We then displayed them in the aquariums that the children made out of old cardboard boxes.

On our final day of topic week, our Maths focus was ordering sea life animals according to their size.

We talked about the language of 'smallest' and 'biggest', and did lots of comparisons of different creatures.



#### YEAR 1 NEWS

For our 'Saving our Oceans' topic week, we have completed several projects all around plastic in the ocean and in Antarctica.

In English, we wrote a letter to the Waitrose supermarket to explain why they should reduce the amount of single-use plastics in their shops and included our own arguments and opinions.

In Science, we looked at why we use plastic if we know it is bad for the environment. The children tested different bags to find out which could hold the most water bottles without breaking, and found out how strong and flexible plastic can be!

They investigated how different materials are affected by water, pressure and stretching. We talked about how plastic might be used so much because it is cheap to produce.

We also found out that the majority of plastic in the oceans is micro-plastic, which can even make its way into our food. The children experimented with different products such as toothpaste and face scrub and filtered them to find micro beads left behind.

In DT, the children each designed their own 'socktopus' based on the story 'Also an Octopus' and planned each step of their design. They then practised a running stitch on Binka sheets before stuffing, stitching and decorating their 'socktopus'. Finally, they evaluated their designs and thought about how they could be improved on.



In Maths, we have been learning about the properties of 3D shapes. We cut out different sea-creature nets to construct. On Wednesday, the author Steven Pass came and read to us from his book: Madge the Mermaid, who is made from pieces washed up from the ocean. He talked about the importance of planning and editing our writing to help build and improve the story writing process. We have begun to plan our story using Madge the Mermaid as inspiration.

To enable Year 2 to understand how damaging plastic waste is on a global scale (whilst linking it to our science unit on materials and their properties), the children carried out an investigation to find out which materials take the longest to decompose. We compared different types of material when we put them in salt-water- the most significant being a wipe (full of plastic particles). Over the week we have been observing which material has begun to break down.

We have enjoyed our Art and DT project this week. Using lots of different techniques we have designed underwater sea-scenes which portray our marine life in and amongst an assortment of plastic debris.

Children will be bringing home any common exception words they still need to learn. Can they use the half term break to learn these. The words they still need to practise are highlighted in yellow.

As you know, Year 2 have been learning the music from Peer Gynt to perform for you on the 6th March. They will be bringing home any lines they need to learn and/or costumes. Thank you for your continued support. We hope you have a lovely half term.



#### YEAR 3 NEWS

We have had a super topic week, focusing on the theme of Save Our Oceans. In Science, we explored the question 'Why do the Oceans matter?' We learned about the problems of plastic pollution and how they affect the sea and the creatures that live in this ecosystem. We looked at photographs for evidence and wrote about how we felt and what we could do to help solve some of these problems.

In English, we all wrote persuasive letters to a local supermarket to ask the manager to stop using single use plastic bags and packaging and to change over to paper bags which are biodegradable instead. We hope to send these letters off and get a reply.

We have also created a large collage using single use plastic lids and foil. We wanted to use this art work to get an important message across. 'Keep Our Sea Plastic Free!'



#### YEAR 4 NEWS

What a fabulous topic week we have had in Year Four! We have really got stuck in to learning about life in the ocean and recognising what affect our plastic usage is having on it.

For our science day on Monday, we learnt about food chains and how creatures are negatively and positively impacted with human intervention. We played a game called 'dinner at the reef' to demonstrate the impact on every member of the food chain when events such as: bans on fishing, oil slick spillage, and the bleaching of the coral reefs, occur. We also carried out an experiment to observe how different materials decompose in 'sea water'. We will be following it closely over the coming months.



On Monday, we took part in a badminton competition at Prince Henry's Grammar School against another Otley school. Year 4 showed fantastic sportsmanship throughout the different badminton-themed activities they took part in.

For our English focus day, we each wrote a persuasive letter to a supermarket to teach them what we've learnt about their excessive use of plastic packaging.

On Thursday, we created posters showing information about the Great Barrier Reef and how it is danger due to our plastic usage. In Maths, we collated the data we had collected of our single use plastic usage before presenting this as a bar chart.

#### YEAR 5 NEWS

One of our tasks was to research an ocean in the world and create an informative poster. On these posters we included information about the ocean, the impact of plastic pollution, the effect it has on sea creatures and on us.

During our writing themed day, we had a visit from an Author Stephen Pass. He spoke to us all about his book 'Madge the Mermaid', and we also read the first two chapters of the story.

On Wednesday morning, we celebrated Class Mass on the Theme of Friendship. Father Lawrie led us in a reflective prayer and this gave us chance to say thank you to God for giving us friends.



On Thursday, we completed Maths challenge which included various tasks such as; addition, multiplication, divisions and statistics. One of our tasks was to create a pie chart using information about pollution on the beaches of the UK. We really enjoyed using a protractor to measure the angles of the pie chart. Joshua said, "It was a little bit tricky but really fun because it was something that we had never done before."

#### YEAR 6 NEWS

Unfortunately due to the bad weather, some of the Year 6 bikeability training had to be cancelled. However, on Wednesday all the children practised their cycling skills on the playground. On Thursday, some children were able to go out on the roads to practise their road safety. Training for Groups B and C will be rearranged for later on in the year.

Today in Year 6, we have been focusing on saving the oceans through Maths. We started the day with a quiz and learnt that:

\* By 2050 there could be more plastic in the oceans than fish

\* Only 9% of the World's plastics are recycled

\*Microplastics are found in 75% of the mussels taken from Britain's beaches

We then looked at a bar chart to find out how long different rubbish takes to biodegrade. After that, we analysed the 718 items of litter found per 100m stretch of beach surveyed in 2017 in Great Britain.
