YEAR R NEWS

What a lovely first week we have had! The children have had a busy and exciting week settling into school! Mrs Dalton and I are so pleased with how well they have come in and we're very excited for this half term adventures.

This week, the children have continued getting to know each other, whilst playing and learning in the different areas of provision and outside area.

This week, we have painted our own self-portraits. We thought carefully about how we are all different. We used mirrors to look at our features and help us think about what colours we needed to use. The children produced some super work and we can't wait to create a display of all their portraits.

We have also enjoyed going to church and meeting our new priest Father Nicholas as well as playing with our Year 6 buddies.

YEAR 1 NEWS

In English this week, we have continued to read 'The Colour Monster Goes to School' and have used this to inspire us to write sentences about what school is, make lists of what we need to take to school and write the names of our friends with capital letters.

In Maths, we have been practising our counting skills and writing our numbers 0-10. We have counted shapes, people, vehicles and dinosaurs. We have also listened to a song to help us write our numbers.

On Wednesday, we had our first music lesson with Mr Rickson. The children enjoyed listening to him playing the ukulele and singing songs including one about the autumn.

Our topic focus this week was looking at the continents in the world. I was very impressed with how the children were able to use a map of the world to label their own map. We also enjoyed listening to the Continents Song.



YEAR 2 NEWS

In Maths this week, we have been learning about place value charts. We have been using them to help us see how many tens and ones a number has. We have used base 10 and written numerals on the place value charts to helps us find similarities and differences of the representations.

As part of our English work, we have been focusing on different sentence types. We have sorted sentences into statements, questions and exclamations and have written some of our own examples. We have also worked hard to understand how a character is feeling. We discussed how the old lady felt in 'A Squash and a Squeeze' and worked together to think of different synonyms for each feeling.

In Science we continued to develop our understanding of things which are living, dead and never been alive. We went investigating around the school grounds to find things which would fit in each list.

In RE, we discussed how we have been chosen by God. We thought carefully about how we can show that we know how to live as Jesus did. We decided that we can help each other, been kind, and even keep our rooms tidy!



YEAR 3 NEWS

Year 3 had a fantastic start to the week when we went on our experience day to Murton Park. After dressing in Stone Age clothes to get into character, we became part of the Wolf Tribe and were introduced to our leader, Mountain. The children took part in several activities including: making pots in the style of the Beaker people; examining artefacts like archaeologists; and taking part in farming and hunting for food. Mountain said that the listening and behaviour displayed by Year 3 was some of the best he has seen in the 7 years he has worked on the Stone Age Village - well done Year 3!




In RE this week, we reflected on how we know we belong to our families. We thought about what is special about them and what we are grateful for.

In DT, we began our unit looking at moving storybooks. We evaluated different styles of moving parts, thinking about what we methods we could use for our own.

YEAR 4 NEWS

We started our week with a very exciting school trip to Murton Park. We spent the day living life as Romans. We made oil lamps, dressed up as Romans and even practiced marching with shields.






In Maths, we have been continuing to deepen our understanding of numbers to 1000. We have used physical resources such as Base 10 to investigate how numbers are made up.

In RE, we have been learning about Joseph, a story from the Old Testament. We enjoyed watching some clips from Joseph and his technicolour dream coat to illustrate the story for us. On Friday, we worked in groups and acted out the whole story, showcasing our performances to the class.

YEAR 5 NEWS

This week in Maths, Year 5 have been working hard at identifying numbers up to 1,000, 10,000, and 100,000. They have built on their prior place value knowledge and used play value charts to help them. They have also gained a new understanding of how to use a Gattegno Chart to show different numbers up to 100,00 and find 10, 100, 1000, 10,000, and 100,000 less or more than a given number.



In English this week, we have been focusing on instruction texts. The children spent time analysing the structure of instruction texts along with identifying the key linguistic features. As a class, we generated our own examples of these key language devices.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we have continued to develop our place value skills to numbers within 10 million. We began the week by multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 and moved on to placing numbers on number lines. Throughout our lessons, we were able to use place value charts to help us with our learning.

During our English lessons, we have been studying Shaun Tan's wordless picture book - The Arrival. We watched all of chapter one and wrote about it in a short setting description. Before we started writing, we collaboratively came up with some great phrases to describe the setting which we could then use in our own writing.

In RE, we created some wonderful poetry linking part of our mission statement - 'St Joseph guides us and inspires us' - to our topic, Called to Serve. We thought about how to St Joseph helps us to serve others by sharing our gifts and talents and made links to this in our poem.






