On Thursday morning, Matthew our Parish Youth worker came into Year 5 to talk about Prayer. Matthew encouraged the children to explore what prayer is. The children came up with lots of ideas of prayer including, what prayer is, why we pray and who we pray for. After this, we discussed different ways we pray such as: hymns, Rosary, silent and though prayers

COLLECTIVE WORSHIP



This month, November, is a special month for remembering those who have passed away. On November 2nd, it was All Souls' Day where we pray for those people who have gone before us. It is also the month where we remember those who have been affected by wars and Year 6 led the whole school Collective Worship this week with the theme of Remembrance Sunday. This month, one of our virtues that the children will be looking at is HOPE - we believe that there is hope after death, as Jesus said on the cross to one of the criminals crucified with him, "I promise that today you will be with me in paradise". As we think about our loved ones no longer with us, may we all find hope and comfort in those words that we will seem again paradise.

CLASS NEWS

YEAR R NEWS

This week, YR have been preparing a birthday party for our class bear Louis, who turned 5 today. The children have spent the

week writing lists of ingredients to make a birthday cake. This afternoon, we all enjoyed a fantastic party for Louis. We played some great party games such as pass the parcel. In every layer was a simple word that the children had to try and read to gain their prize! The children each enjoyed a cake that they had made.

In Maths, we have been practising number bonds to 5. We explored the different number bonds using the 'part, part, whole' model. This involves the children identifying the two different parts that make up a number before finding the whole e.g. for five, the children would say " 3 is part, 2 is part and 5 is the whole" or "4 is a part, 1 is a part and 5 is the whole."

In Phonics, we have been revising all the sounds we have learnt so far. Next week we will carry out an assessment of your child to identify any sounds they are not confident with. Please practice all the sounds taught so far, as can be seen in the red sound book.

On Thursday, YR went to Mass for the first time. The children behaved beautifully, joining in well with the singing and prayers.

Please make sure all school library books are returned each week so your child can swap it for another book.

YEAR 1 NEWS

This week in numeracy in Year 1 we have been identifying 3D shapes. We matched 3D shapes to their names and built a castle out of them, then made a list of which shapes we could see in our castles. We also used a 'feely bag' of shapes to test our knowledge of faces, edges and vertices - Miss Armitage was very impressed that the children could guess every one!

In literacy this week we have been starting to think about writing our own story about a lost toy like 'Dogger'. We have explored what a setting is and how to make it come alive with description. We have also thought about what emotions we might feel if we lost something, and created our own word banks.

In RE we have started our new topic 'Mary, Mother of God'. We have learned about the Annunciation story and looked at how Mary and the Angel Gabriel are portrayed in art. We discussed how Mary might have felt when she first saw Gabriel, and what it would be like to hear the most amazing news from such an important visitor!

In History this week we have been finding out about toys from the past. Miss Armitage used the boys and girls' suggestions of where we can find out information about the past to make 'research stations'. All the children used historical artefacts, books and pictures to learn about toys from the past, and some children even used the computers to browse the internet and find information.

We have also been talking about Anti-Bullying Week and what we can do to make everyone feel safe and happy at school. We talked about how other people's happiness is in our hands, and how we can beat bullying and unkindness through our own actions.

YEAR 2 NEWS

For our new topic in English on Traditional Tales we discussed the different ways to describe the appearance and personality of the main character Maximus in the tale of *Maximus and the Beanstalk* We identified and practised using coordinating and subordinating conjunctions these help us to link ideas and provide more detail in our sentences.

In Maths we have been practising subtraction with a tens and ones grid. We have also looked at addition and subtraction as inverse operations and have written calculations that demonstrate this relationship

For RE this week, we have been reflecting on Mysteries. We thought about the difference between a puzzle and a mystery. We wrote about the things that we wonder about... Heidi wanted to know how God spoke to his chosen people?

Practice for our Christmas production called 'Prickly Hay' has got off to a flying start. We've enjoyed learning lots of new songs in music, which we can't wait for you to hear. Your child will be bringing home their lines and details of their required costume this week.

Finally a big thank you to those parents who joined us on Thursday when Year 2 led the KS1 Mass on Friendship. Fr Lawrie and Ms Choma commended Year 2 for both their delivery of lines and fantastic behaviour.











YEAR 3 NEWS

It has been a very busy week in Year 3. We

started our Friendship themed week with our Odd Socks Day. We wore our brightest odd socks to remember that everyone is different and unique and we thought about how we could focus on kindness and kind words during the week ahead.

On Tuesday we had a super day out enjoying an exciting film at the Vue Cinema, followed by an afternoon of reflection, worship and exploration at Kirkstall Abbey.

After a brief history of the Abbey and Collective Worship led by Mrs Harvey, the children had the chance to investigate their surroundings and complete a Maths trail.

In our Maths lessons we have also been using equipment and traditional column methods to add 2 and 3 -digit numbers. In English we have explored adverbs and played adverb games to gain a more confident understanding of the use of adverbs in our writing.

YEAR 4 NEWS

This week in RE, year four started our new topic of 'Trust in God'. We started by answering the question 'What is God?'. In pairs we created models of what we perceived God as and what objects or symbols we thought represented him.

On Monday, to commemorate Remembrance Day, we wrote 'The Important Thing' poems after learning about what we do on Remembrance day and why. We used our 5 senses to really thing about the different things we come across on this day.

To celebrate 'Friendship Week', we thought about how we can make choices to help those in need around us, and how we can be extra kind to others - it doesn't take a lot! We created '20 days of kindness' calendars which we are going to keep at school and at home, ticking off each act of kindness as we do it.

In Maths, we looked at estimating answers. We practiced rounding numbers in order to estimate what our answer might be. We learnt about how we can make a more accurate estimate, and used column addition and subtraction to check the actual answers, thinking how close our estimates were.

As it was Remembrance day on Monday, we reflected on how important this day is, we discussed why we wear poppies and what they resemble. We the looked at various WW1 poems such as 'Flanders Fields' and 'For the Fallen'. After exploring these poems, we had a god at writing our own poems about Remembrance Day. During the afternoon, we created some brilliant art work using different mediums and techniques.

On Tuesday, we had a great day at the cinema and Kirkstall Abbey. After the watching the film, we had a Collective Worship about God's love for us. We then reflected on God's wonderful gifts. We then explored Kirkstall Abbey, we carried out a Maths and English trail, where we had to answer various question related to the Abbey.

In Maths, we have been focusing on the topic statistics. We looked at line graphs and interpreted information from them. We also had a go at drawing our own line graphs using information.

YEAR 6 NEWS

Last week, Year 6 had a fun if wet day at Lotherton Hall learning about how Lotherton Hall was used as a hospital in WW1: they handled different artefacts, mapped out a hospital plan, pretended to treat some of the injuries that patients at Lotherton Hall would have had and finished singing WW1 songs in the Chapel. In the afternoon, the children learnt about how animals have adapted to their environment by looking at different model skulls. We found out about tapirs, warty pigs, snakes and penguins.

On Thursday, Father Lawrie came to visit Year 6 to tell us about his calling to the priesthood and about his training which he started when he was nearly 12 years old! We also learnt that he is able to use sign language. Next week, we will be starting our new RE topic of "Justice".

We also had visitors to Year 6 on Wednesday - two volunteers from the Otley Museum came to tell us about what life was like during World war One. They also brought different things for us to look at including: war medals, model bullets and a soldier's helmet.

As part of Friendship Week, Year 6 have written poems about what friendship means to them.


