OTLEY SCIENCE FESTIVAL



Y1 and Y2 had a wonderful time learning about clouds made from dry ice. They learnt that dry ice is carbon dioxide which looks like ice (solid); however, when it melts, it is actually a gas and produces bubbles. There was a gasp of awe when the dry ice hit the warm water and a cloud billowed out. The children had the opportunity to run their fingers through the clouds. The children could choose to have a cloud shower on their head, hands or feet. Best of all, was the juice cloud. Lemon, strawberry and blackcurrant juice was mixed together with warm water and dry ice! We did expect a purple cloud - it was still white - but it did smell and taste like juice.





Y3 and Y4 were lucky enough to experience Marty Jopson's Science Show in person on Wednesday, whilst Y5 and Y6 joined on Zoom. They were treated to amazing scientific stunts, including holding a flame without being burned, the 'Pendulum of Doom', karate chopping through wood, and using a whip to rip newspaper. There were star turns from the staff, and everyone enjoyed the dramatic experiments and scientific knowledge they gained.



Thank you to all the parent helpers who assisted on the trips. We wouldn't be able to do it without you!










FENCING WORKSHOP

CLASS NEWS



YEAR R NEWS

In Literacy, we have been reading the story of 'The Little Red Hen'. We made our own story boards, drawing pictures of each part of the story. We learnt actions and enjoyed performing the story for Buddies at the end of the week.

In Maths, we have been focusing on numbers 4 and 5. We looked at objects that represent each number and the composition of each for example 5 can made by adding 2 and 3. We learnt about a five frame and how we can use this to help us with our counting. We talked about the importance of putting our finger on each object once when counting out loud.

In RE, we talked about how God gives us special gifts that we can share with others. Daisy said, "I'm good at drawing so I could make someone a card for their birthday."


This week is Anti Bullying week and theme is 'One Kind Word'. We did a circle time about how we can be kind in our classroom. Ottilie said, "I can help my friends when they have lots of things to carry," and Theo said, "I can share my toys with my friends". We made a kindness jar and each time someone did something kind we put a button in. It is already very full!



YEAR 1 NEWS

This week in Maths, we have been measuring in centimetres (cm). We have been examining our class rulers and how we use them. We know that we have to begin our measuring by starting at 0. We enjoyed putting this into practice and measuring small objects around the classroom.

In English, we have been writing instructions for the perfect bowl of porridge. We thought about our ingredients, utensils and the steps required to make the porridge. We started each instruction with a bossy verb (imperative).



In PE, we have been putting our Christmas performance songs into action by performing dance moves. We have just about secured the moves, we now need to practise them for our fantastic Christmas performance!


On Friday, we started our DT unit on Making a Moving Storybook. We have been learning about the mechanisms within the book and how we can make them move. We chose to make a rabbit or a car as our design piece.

YEAR 2 NEWS

This week in Maths, we have moved on to practising our subtraction skills. We have been looking at how we can partition numbers to make subtraction easier. We then also looked at crossing ten when we are subtracting a 1-digit number from a 2-digit number. We practised exchanging 1 ten for 10 ones.

In English, as part of Anti-Bullying Week, we wrote our own friendship recipes. We added a pinch of honesty, a dash of fun and a good dollop of kindness. Once we had decided on the ingredients, we needed to write the instructions of how to make a perfect friend.

As part of our RE work, we learnt about the Annunciation. We listened to the events which took place and imagined what the Angel said to Mary and how Mary must have felt.












YEAR 3 NEWS

In Maths, we revisited column subtraction, but this time with an exchange! We used counters to help us, making sure we were correctly doing the exchange in our written method.

On Thursday in English, we wrote character descriptions of a woolly mammoth we had come across in our book. We had some fantastic ideas, and even included some similies!



In P.E the children had the chance to meet two Fencing coaches and to find out more about the basics of Fencing. They played games and had lots of skills practise, learning more about Fencing moves and the specialist vocabulary.

YEAR 4 NEWS

In English, we have created our own acrostic poems inspired by the Anti-Bullying Week slogan which is 'One Kind Word'. We thought about how kindness makes us feel as well as finding synonyms and phrases to include in our poetry.

In Maths, we have consolidated our knowledge of units of measurement up to metres, and introduced kilometres. The children worked hard to convert lengths into different units of measurement in order to add and subtract them.

In RE, we looked at Mary as an example of perfect faith in God. The children worked in pairs to find Bible quotations that showed Mary's trust in God, and created a fact file to answer questions.

In Science, we looked at how sound travels and how the ear works. The children are currently planning their own Science shows to explain what they have found out, complete with investigations and examples. We will hopefully film them next week!



YEAR 5 NEWS

This week in English, the children have enjoyed writing their own additional task for Heracles to complete. They have thought about using noun phrases, similes and parenthesis.

In Maths, we have been reading and interpreting different tables and timetables. We have also looked at converting times to the 24-hour clock and vice versa.

On Thursday afternoon, we started our new DT topic - bridges. The children looked at different pictures of beam and arch bridges before making their own simple versions using weights to see which was strongest. We were amazed how much stronger the bridges were just by folding the card.

In Year 5, we have thought about the theme of this year's Anti-Bullying Week - ONE KIND WORD by making a kindness chain. We also linked anti-bullying week to our work in RE on the Ten Commandments. We wrote our own commandments for how we should treat each other in Year 5.

YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we have been recapping our knowledge of square and cubes numbers. We began with a challenge to find out if a number was a square number by trying to make an array which is the shape of a square.

As our morning job, we have had a go at completing some of the Barvember challenges from White Rose Maths. We have really enjoyed getting stuck into them and using our problem solving skills.

In English, we have been focusing on editing our diary entry. In particular, we have looked at sentence structure, length of sentences and sentence openers. After we edited our writing, we redrafted this into our books.

In RE, we defined what 'Justice' and 'Injustice' is. We looked at different short stories and said why we thought it was just or unjust. We linked our reasons to Bible references that we found.

On Thursday, we visited our buddies and listened to them retell the story of 'The Little Red Hen'. We thought they were amazing – well done YR!
