What a fantastic week we have had this week in school. Reception Class made box models of their favourite buildings in Otley, painted pictures and designed a BeeBot map of Otley. Y1 went up the Chevin on a walk to explore our countryside and forest, Y2 walked the length and breadth of Otley on Market Day to see how things worked, visited lots of our old buildings and received a guided tour around the Courthouse. They have also made lots of craft items to sell in their own 'Market' this afternoon. They had a visit from a local Cartographer who showed them how to make a model of Otley! Y3 & Y4 also took a walk around Otley and sketched various buildings and visited many local hotspots that they perhaps wouldn't normally have noticed whilst walking around town. Y5 were looking at a DT & Maths focus and recreated Otley Bridge! Y6 spent the week looking at Victorian Otley and finished it off by dressing in Victorian clothing today!

Year 4 have had a busy week learning about Otley. At the beginning of the week we learnt about Otley in the past and enjoyed having a visit from a lovely lady called Joyce who has lived in Otley all her life and talked about going to school where naughty children were caned. She also remembered going to the cinema in Otley and what life was like in Otley during World War Two. To find out more about Otley's past we also had a walk around the town looking at buildings and gravestones in the churchyard! At the end of the week we looked at the Geography of Otley. We looked at maps of Otley and tried to find our school and other buildings. We were able to identify with Mrs Pratt's help that the map was at least 24 years old as various things were different to how they are now. We then focused our work on the River Wharfe and learnt about where it flows; the wildlife that lives in the Wharfe area and how the river is used (we had lots of experts about fishing!!!).
