
<u>PE Uniform:</u> On PE days the children must come to school in their green PE shorts and/or **green joggers**. Thank you for your cooperation.

Library Visits





During the week, the children have been talking about Lent and thinking about what Lent promises they would like to do this year. Some children have decided to give up things and some have decided to do something extra.



COLLECTIVE WORSHIP

Thank you to Year 3 who led this morning's Collective Worship. With Fairtrade Fortnight starting next week, they discussed how our choices can affect the world around us, and why choosing Fairtrade products is so important.

They shared the stories of some farmers from different countries around the world, and how Fairtrade means they receive better working conditions and fairer pay. The class also shared some of the poetry they had written about this topic. We were reminded of the words of Leviticus about treating people fairly and will be thinking carefully about the choices we make, and their effect on others, over Fairtrade Fortnight.



VIRTUE

On Thursday, we thought about our new virtue in Collective Worship which is Self-Control.

We thought about times when we may be tempted to do make the wrong choices or not to keep our Lent promises, but we know that Jesus is there to help us when we might be tempted. We listened to the story of Jesus being tempted in the desert and reflected on how he showed self-control.

YEAR R NEWS

What a great week we have had in Reception! On Monday we had a visit from the Dogs Trust. We learnt how to be safe around dogs and how to take care of them.

Our new topic this half term is Transport. In Literacy, we have been reading the story of 'The Train Ride' by June Crebbin. We made lists of some of the things that were seen on the little girls journey.



In Maths, we have continued learning about finding the total of 2 groups. We learnt about part- whole models, and how the two parts add together to make the whole amount.

In RE, we learnt about kindness and how Jesus wants us to show kindness to each other. We each wrote an act of kindness and added it to our 'Kindness Jar.'

On Tuesday, we had lots of fun with our Buddies decorating pancakes. We also practised flipping pretend pancakes. Everyone agreed it was lots of fun and a delicious start to our day!

YEAR 1 NEWS

In RE, we have reflected on how we prepare spiritually throughout the forty days of Lent. We thought about the three traditional practices to be taken up with renewed vigour during this time: prayer, fasting and almsgiving and identified the different ways that we have been doing this CAFOD Faith lunch, Toast Tuesdays etc...

On Friday in Art, we learnt about the colour spectrum and primary colours. We know that we can mix the primary colours (red, yellow & blue) together to make new colours.

This week in Maths, we have begun to look at different methods for addition, within 20 this has included using our number bond knowledge to help with our understanding when adding 10 more. We have also began looking at subtraction.

In English we have written postcards telling Milo's meerkat family (over in the Kalahari desert) all about the exciting things he's done with Y1.

In Topic, we have been thinking about settlements. In Y1 this includes: Otley, Guiseley, Menston, Yeadon and Arthington). We thought about our postcode and the street that we live on. We enjoyed looking at all the different pictures of our houses. We drew pictures of our homes.



YEAR 2 NEWS

In Maths, we have been practising doubling and halving numbers. We noticed a connection with the 2 times table when we are doubling. We also looked at odd and even numbers and investigated whether or not we also end with an even number when we add two single digit numbers together.

In English, we started a new book - The Tiger Who Came to Tea. by Judith Kerr. We all enjoyed discussing what it would be like to have a tiger round for tea. We then thought about having a tea party of our own. We looked at an invitation and discussed the features of an invitation.

This half term, in RE, we are learning all about The Mass. This week we discussed why people go to Mass and why it is important to Christians. We learnt that people go to Mass to be closer to God, to receive a blessing, to listen to readings and because Jesus calls us to Mass. We know that Mass is important because it is a gift from God.

We all had a wonderfully 'sticky' time on pancake day. We all chose our favourite toppings and loaded our pancakes. We then went out to the pavilion to enjoy our perfect pancakes!

YEAR 3 NEWS

In Science, year three have started their new topic looking at plants. We discussed what the requirements for life and growth are and then devised an experiment to test the impact on a plant if these requirements are removed. We will observe our plants over the next few weeks and record and analyse our results.

In Art, we have designed and created our own printing blocks as part of our William Morris artist study. We'll be using these to create our own repeated patterns in the style of the Victorian artist.



In Maths, we have started our Length and Perimeter topic. We have been building on our understanding of metres and centimetres, and learning how to measure in millimetres.

YEAR 4 NEWS

In RE this week, the children learnt about the Jewish holy day, Sabbath. The children thought about different questions that they would like to know about the Sabbath and then watched a short video to help them answer some of the questions. They learnt about the importance of resting on the Sabbath because that is what God did on the 7th day after he created the world.



Our focus in Maths this week has been about perimeter. The children have calculated the perimeter of rectangles and rectilinear shapes - trying not to get it confused with the area.

This week, Year 4 finished reading our book, "The Matchbox Diary" and wrote a summary of the book. They also wrote their own recount about an event in their lives trying to use fronted adverbials.

YEAR 5 NEWS

In Maths this week, the children have continued to look at multiplication questions and using the column method to answer them, more specifically looking at multiplying 3-digit and 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers. The children have worked really hard with this topic so far and are showing good levels of understanding, even when some questions can be challenging.

In Art this week, Year 5 have enjoyed spending time looking at, in depth, more of Frida Kahlo's self portraits. Analysing the techniques that are the same among some of her portraits and what techniques have changed. The children then had chance to use a mirror to look closely at their own facial features and where they are positioned and whether or not their classmates features looked the same too. They then had chance to begin sketching a proportionate self portrait using the same methods that Kahlo used for hers.

In Geography, the children have really enjoyed learning about the Grand Canyon. The children spent time reading and researching different features of the Grand Canyon, from how hot it is, to how many tourists visit their each year. They were surprised with some of their findings. We then moved on to look at how it was formed, due to water erosion, rain fall and ice erosion. The children found this fascinating.



YEAR 6 NEWS

In Maths, we started our new topic of algebra which we initially thought might be quite tricky but it definitely is not. We have really enjoyed understanding how a letter can be used as a unknown value. Through use of manipulatives, we showed expressions and this really helped us to understand how a letter has a value.

In English, we continued to develop our knowledge about orangutans in the wild. We used the chocolate bar approach to collect more facts and then used those facts to write a non-chronological report.

In Computing, we looked at the use of spreadsheets and how they can display data. We created our own spreadsheets and learnt how to use the function: auto sum.

On Tuesday, we spent some of the morning with our YR buddies putting topping on pancakes – they were delicious but a bit sticky!
