CLIMATE CHANGE

We have had a very busy week learning all about our Climate and the threat of Global Warming.

On Monday, the children came to school wearing green or brown to celebrate International Day of Forests. We had an assembly to find out how the day is celebrated all over the world and why it is so important to protect trees and forests.

Members of the Climate Council from Year 6 have been visiting every class in school this week. They have organised Global Warming lessons and activities in every class from Reception to Year 6.

They have put a lot of thought into producing PowerPoint Presentations at the right level for every class. Well done to Abigail, Joseph, Zahra, Mia, Agnes and Esther for all their hard work and enthusiasm!

Thursday was Earth Hour Day and each class has turned their electricity, lights and devices off for one hour to think about how hard it can be to save energy and cut down on fossil fuel usage.

The official Earth Hour across the world is Saturday 26th March 8.30-9.30pm. If you have a go at this at home it will be very dark and you will need an adult to light some candles!

Year Reception and Year 6 buddies loved looking at all the different types of trees and shrubbery on the school field. We have had a very artistic week in Y1; we created different shades of green to paint our rainforest leaves and used a mosaic of animal furs and skin to cover our jungle animals.

Y2 enjoyed a visit from Y6 pupils and created a letter to send to the Prime Minister about their concerns for the climate and possible solutions.

In Y3, we read about British forests, produced posters explaining why trees are so important and enjoyed some quiet time 'tree-hugging' in the afternoon.

In Y4, have loved learning about the rainforest and medicine produced from rainforest plants. During Earth Hour, we wrote poetry about trees and rainforests.

In Y5, we have learnt about the effects of deforestation on our ecosystems. We have found out one of the causes is palm oil farming.

CLASS NEWS

YEAR R NEWS

What a busy week it has been in Reception! We started off the week learning about the importance of trees. In the afternoon, we enjoyed spending time with our buddies whilst looking at the wonderful trees we have on our school field. We even tried some tree hugging. We all agreed we felt calmer and happier when we returned to the classroom!



On Tuesday, enjoyed a visit from Esther and Agnes from Year 6 who came to teach us the importance of looking after our world. We learnt that there are lots of things that we can do to make a difference for future generations to come. We also learnt about the importance of recycling and had a go at sorting different materials into the right boxes.

In Maths, we have been learning about 3D shapes. We enjoyed hunting around school to see what 3D shapes we could find. We learnt about the properties of each face and enjoyed using vocabulary such as faces, vertices and edges.

In RE, we have been learning about the importance of forgiveness. We heard the story of Peter Denying Jesus three times. We learnt that we must try to forgive just like Jesus forgave Peter.

YEAR 1 NEWS

What a jam-packed climate change week we have had in Y1! We've enjoyed rainforest maths, by colouring in calculations to reveal the hidden rainforest animal.

We've had amazing presentations from Y6 which taught us how human activity is causing worldwide temperatures to rise higher and faster than any time we know of in the past...and what we can do to combat this?

In Science, we completed a matching activity to help us learn about the factors that cause climate change. We learnt how more frequent and intense drought, storms, heat waves, rising sea levels, melting glaciers and warming oceans can directly harm animals, destroy the places they live, and wreak havoc on people's livelihoods and communities.

We've loved doing lots of art this week too. We used our newfound knowledge of mixing paints to make different shades of green this enabled us to paint bright and vibrant rainforest leaves. We made animal mosaics, to place in our rainforest scenes.

We've also felt the benefit of hugging trees, made Earth Hour posters, led a beautiful KS1 Mass, looked at books in the Scholastic Book Fair and had a blast at Friday afternoon games. Wow, we have crammed in a lot. It has been a brilliant week!



YEAR 2 NEWS

Thank you to the parents who joined us for our class assembly. All of the children spoke clearly and shared their thoughts about Mother's Day.

In English, Year 2 have written some beautiful poems for Mothing Sunday. They thought very carefully about their mums and what makes them so special. Everybody came up with some excellent adjectives and we even thought of some similes! We hope that all of our Mums enjoy reading your poems and your special day.

In Maths, we continued our work on fractions and started to recognise quarters and found quarters of amount by dividing objects into 4 groups. We are beginning to understand how important knowing our multiples of 2 and 4 are. We also found out that to find a quarter, we halve the number and then halve it again.

As it has been climate week, we have been finding out about how important trees are. We decided to create our own tree collages by using recycled card and paper only. We enjoyed painting our backgrounds and developed our cutting skills to help us create the branches and leaves.



YEAR 3 NEWS

In English, we have been reading and finding out about the Tropical Rainforests of the world. We have presented the information about different forest layers using pictures and words. For our Pied Piper unit, we were asked to write a persuasive advert to find a 'rat catcher'. We began by identifying the different features of a persuasive advert, before thinking about our own.

In Maths, we made some of our own pictograms and learnt the importance of a key to understand the number each picture represents. We then moved on to interpreting and drawing bar charts. We collected our own data using a tally chart and presented our findings as a bar chart.

In Science, we have been learning about global warming and the greenhouse effect. We have learnt how trees store carbon, breathe out Oxygen and help to produce rain – great for the atmosphere!

In DT, we continued creating our cushions. We created templates of our endangered animals and cut out the shape from material.



YEAR 4 NEWS

This week we have focused on our Geography topic of Rainforests as part of our Climate Action Week Work.

On Monday, we learned about the different layers of the rainforest, including the animals that might inhabit each layer. We used this knowledge to create dioramas that represented the layers of the rainforest.

On Tuesday, we learned about the different medicines humans can produce from rainforest plants. We used our new school laptops(!) to research the different products that we rely on the rainforest to grow.

On Wednesday, we learned about David Attenborough's Four Imperatives to reverse climate change. We thought about deforestation and learned about what humans can do to reduce our impact on biodiversity in forests and woodland.

On Thursday, we designed and built alarm systems that could protect rainforests from poachers and other trespassers, creating circuits containing different types of switches.

Finally, we ended the week by preparing for Mother's Day and enjoying a Games Afternoon led by the Mini Vinnies. What a week!



YEAR 5 NEWS

Year 5 have enjoyed using the new laptops this week, not only in ICT but also in DT. In ICT, we ended our work on Databases by looking at real-life databases focusing on web-based databases about flights. The children took on the role of travel agents and tried to find flights to different destinations at different airports using the sort function to find the cheapest flights.



In DT, we used the laptops to find out the nutritional value of a Spaghetti Bolognese recipe, the children then adapted the recipe to try to make it healthier.

As part of our Climate Change Week, the children have been finding out about palm oil in their different lessons. They were surprised to find out about all the different products that contain palm oil and have found out how palm oil farming is contributing to deforestation and damaging ecosystems. In English, they have started writing persuasive letters to palm oil farms trying to persuade them to stop deforestation.

YEAR 6 NEWS

Year 6 have enjoyed Climate Week. We have learned about the advantages and disadvantages of different types of renewable energy; designed climate action posters; and played games in French during our Earth Hour. We even got to hug a tree and try out some bark rubbing with our Reception buddies!

In Maths, we have been getting to grips with algebra, through finding one step and two step rules, as well as substituting. Year 6 have been asking for weeks when they would be able to do some algebra, so they were delighted when they found out our new topic for this week. Although they now realise that they have actually been doing forms of algebra since Year 1 without realising it!


