

St Joseph's Catholic Primary School Curriculum Information Letter

ENGLISH

Narrative Poetry

The children will read the poem, "The Listeners" and look at the structure of the poem before writing their own stanza to add to the poem. They will then read a poem called "The Ridge" looking at the use of figurative language and then have a go at writing their own poems.

Non-Chronological Reports

The children will read a range of non-chronological reports linked to our mountain work in Geography and will identify the features before writing their own report.

Explanation Texts

The children will read, "How do volcanoes erupt?" and identify the features of explanation texts before writing their own explanations.

"When the Giant stirred"

When reading this narrative story, the focus will be on the language used by the author to describe the setting and feelings of the characters. The children will then try to use this language in their own stories.

RE

Inspirational People

In this unit, the children will learn about the qualities possessed by followers of Jesus through the theme of inspirational people. They will be introduced to inspirational followers of Jesus like Fr. Damien and be encouraged to reflect on how they can follow Jesus in their own lives.

Reconciliation

In this unit, the children will learn that God heals our friendship with him and others through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. They will read the 'Parable of the Lost Son' expressing opinions about the different characters.

Decimals & Percentages

- Ordering, comparing and rounding decimals.
- Decimals and percentages as fractions.

Perimeter – Perimeter and area of shapes.

Statistics – Read and interpret line graphs and tables, draw line graphs.

Extreme Earth

- The structure of the Earth.

- Effects of volcanoes and earthquakes.

<p>RE – Encourage the children to talk about people who they think are inspirational or to find out about some different saints. Read the stories of Holy Week with your children.</p> <p>English – Discuss new vocabulary with your child from their reading. Ask your child to identify different types of punctuation and types of word (eg noun, verb, adjective, adverb, determiner, preposition) when they are reading. Share your favourite poems with your child. Look at different non-fiction books together and look at the layout.</p> <p>Maths - Encourage your child to practise the times table facts, this can be done using Times Table Rockstars. Practise written methods for multiplication and division. Look out for fractions, decimals and percentages in everyday life.</p>	<p>Reading books can be changed when needed on any day.
