St Joseph's Catholic Primary School Curriculum Information Letter

<u>ENGLISH</u>

Summer 1 - Cloud Tea Monkeys

In this unit of learning, children are exposed to a range of language activities to stimulate grammatical development and reading comprehension skills. Using the text as inspiration, the children will write a set of instructions on the art of tea tasting and a formal letter to an employer.

Then, inspired by our History topic, the children will write a non-chronological report about Ancient Egypt and a newspaper report on Howard Carter's discovery of Tutankhamen's tomb.

Summer 2 - Jim: A Cautionary Tale

Our text in the second half of the summer term will see the children focus on poetry, preparing a range of poems to read aloud and to perform. They will also write a narrative poem based on the text.

HISTORY & GEOGRAPHY

History: Ancient Egypt


Children will explore the achievements of the Ancient Egyptian civilisation and, through looking at the chronology of world history, make comparisons to life in Britain. Children will learn about Ancient Egyptian writing, the significance of the River Nile, Gods, pharaohs, pyramids and tombs.

Geography: In the Desert

Children will explore what deserts are, where in the world they are located and how they are formed. They will investigate the weather and climate of deserts, how deserts are used by humans and consider the challenges faced by those who live in the desert.

<u>FRENCH</u> Circle of Life

Children will learn animal names and their habitats. They will begin to build sentences to describe the food chain.

Celebrating Easter & Pentecost

This half term, the children will learn that God the Father raised Jesus from the dead on Easter Sunday. They will learn that because Jesus rose from the dead we too will rise from the dead. They will hear the story of the appearance of Jesus on the road to Emmaus and to Thomas. They will also hear and reflect on the story of the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Being a Christian

After half term, they will develop their understanding of what being a Christian involves. They will reflect on the joy and challenges involved in following Jesus and learn about these through the lives of Ss. Peter and Paul. The children will reflect on their gifts and talents and the gifts the Church calls Sacraments, especially the Eucharist. They will reflect on how to use our gifts to be a Christian.

Health Choices and habits; Feelings; Personal strength and achievements; Safety in the local environment and unfamiliar places.

<u>ART & DT</u>

In Art, we will be exploring the work of Seurat and finding out how, when and why the Pointillist movement began. The children will then identify some other Pointillist artists before creating their own piece of artwork in this style. In DT, the children will be investigating and analysing a range of neon signs. Using this investigation, they will then develop ideas for their own signs before designing and making these.

SCIENCE

<u>Summer 1 - Animals including humans</u> Children will learn about the importance of nutrition and are introduced to the main body parts associated with the skeleton and muscles. We work scientifically by identifying and grouping animals with and without skeletons and observing and comparing their movement. Children will compare and contrast the diets of different animals.

<u>Summer 2 - Forces</u> Children will explore forces, friction and magnetism. They will observe the difference between magnetic and non-magnetic forces.

ICT – Programming

Year 3 will explore the sequence of coding in Scratch. They will learn the basics of programming, creating their own programme featuring sequences in music.
